At our March meeting, Joan W. demonstrated our new projector and ring lamp, she also taught us how to make Tiny Toe Up Socks. The pattern for the socks was sent with the March newsletter. Thank you to Joan for a very well put together and informative presentation.

#### Projector Set-Up:

The projector is capable of being hooked up to a laptop, iPad or other tablet, or a phone and will project images onto the wall. The phone can be suspended from the new ring lamp; and with this set up, you can do a live demonstration and have it projected for all to see. Alternatively, with your laptop/tablet as a source, you can project your own previously recorded videos, screen images, and/or Internet content. There is WiFi at Joslyn Center. In addition to the projector and ring lamp, we have a "bag of crap" (Joan's words!) which contains a charger block, extension cords, cables to plug various devices into the projector and other miscellaneous bits and bobs. Plus, the all-important instructions for how to use all this stuff.

All this provides lots of possibilities to get away from demonstrations with needles and yarn that nobody can really see - (or with Joan's I-cord "yarn" and monster needles - which may still be missing, I'm not sure)! Our projector is mainly intended to help with our monthly programs but also will be available for other purposes as needed. The idea is that, after each monthly meeting, the next month's program presenter will take the projector and other stuff home with them. They can then have a month to learn how to use the equipment and decide how it fits with their program. We may have some learning curve issues to make that work, but this is a heads up that neither Joan nor I want to be the forever teachers of how to use the projector! So we will try to make this as self-evident as possible. Although, in Dumbledore's immortal words, help is always available to those who ask...
